OUR FAITH IN ACTION

"So when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift."

Matthew 5:23-24

Some of you know that a major recent concern has been "Christian Nationalism," especially the sect known as "Seven Mountain Christian Nationalism." While a very small group has spoken in favor of this movement, many of us were surprised at their prominence, organization, and acceptance by some political activists at the national level.

I'm happy to say that the current result of the organized campaign to promote Christian Nationalism has been to greatly diminish its impact. Christian Nationalists seem surprised by the overwhelming rejection of their proposals by Christians across the board. While these arguments may seem obscure, I suspect they can help us in our Christian walk.

The main thrust of the Christian National Movement is to legislate a narrow form of political Christianity. There's great disagreement on what such legislation would look like - some wish to legally disenfranchise women of the vote or to create new, sub-citizen categories for immigrants. Still others want to limit access to the polls based on faith and income. Nearly all promote a favored-citizenship status for Christians (though defining "Christian" itself is a difficult process). Christian Nationalists argue that to preserve our status as a Christian nation during a time of spiritual decline, we should transfer the locus of faith from houses of worship to the federal government.

Sometimes formal U.S. Christianity can make us very proud. The rejection of these proposals has been sweeping and unified. Christian leaders on both the left and the right have come together to oppose the idea based on Christian history,

theology, and the Holy Bible. For example, the phrase "separation of church and state" arose from American Baptists in the 1700s, who found that local laws favoring the most popular denominations forced heavier taxes on smaller denominations (who were usually Baptist and Presbyterian). They considered this corrupting of both the government and human souls. Theologically, the idea of "forced faith" opposes the Gospel of Jesus, Who accepted death without resistance in order to win us back to God. The Bible teaches that anyone who takes on the weapons of state-sanctioned force is inherently opposed to God, as we're reading right now in Revelation. Many Evangelicals predict that putting faith in the hands of government will eventually lead to corruption of faith, no matter what the original intent may be.

What does that mean for us, who are largely unaffected by these debates? One lesson is that trying to force faith on others is always a losing proposition. We see that today in the growing rejection of evangelicalism in our country. In national surveys, congregations that identify as "Evangelical" have lost an average of 17% of their members, driven largely by young adults. These young adults often call themselves "exvangelical survivors" and speak angrily about how mainline Church history and teachings were kept secret from them. Sadly, they're so embittered by their church experiences that most leave organized religion entirely.

Another is that trials can reveal the true mettle of our faith. Either we try to follow Jesus in every situation or we are only fair-weather friends, disciples who desert Him once the going gets tough. A true test of faith is whether we do our best to live according to His example and teaching in difficult circumstances.

Finally, I hope we remember the words of Jesus quoted above, including in our treatment of Christian Nationalists. Many of them would not fit the Church's historical definition of "Christian" (for example, a number of neo-Fascists support Christian Nationalism). As much as I shouldn't need to write it. let's remember they're all children of God. The greatest Kingdom role we can play is to offer healing in the Name of Christ. A desire to "force" faith on others arises from fear, and is an unhealthy response to fear borne of personal weakness. In confession, we acknowledge that we all carry some kind of desire to control others and exalt ourselves. We all need healing, and we all are called to extend Christ's healing to others.

Perhaps the Christian Nationalists have grown quieter because they've found so few allies. Perhaps they're biding their time, trying not to alarm voters before a presidential election. No matter the reason, we can remember the words of the Christian martyr Dietrich Boenhoffer: "Violence can never overcome evil - evil understands violence, violence nurtures evil. The only thing that can overcome evil is a steadfast, resolute love." Legislating personal privilege over the rights of others is a form of spiritual violence. However opposed others' responses are to the Gospel lovingly entrusted to us by Jesus, we can do our best to follow His example, in this instance and always. In that way, we become the Body of Christ, end divisions, and spread the Gospel.

Brief Update on our Breeze Online Directory

The online management database we use is frequently updated, so some pages have changed. We've also received several requests to hold a refresher presentation on how to access the online directory, which we'll hold in the fall. For now, here's some information I hope helps connect you with others in the congregation and keeps you connected with them.

The first step in using Breeze is to respond to the invitation to enroll sent from the church office via email. If you haven't received one or it came a long time ago, please let the Office Manager know and one can be sent during regular office hours. When the email invitation comes, you can click a link within the email that will automatically direct you to breezechms.com After you have enrolled, your browser will usually direct you to the username and password sign-in page, but the very first time (or any time you empty your browser cache) you will be asked to enter the church "web address." Our church's web address is: HoneoyeFallsPC.


It's important that you type it exactly that way, with a capital H, capital F, and capital PC. After entering the address, click "Continue" and you will be directed to a page to create your personal user name and password.

Enter a user name and password, then confirm your password.*Please keep track of your user name and password – you are the only one who knows what they are. Once you're in the directory, click on your name in the "My Profile" section. Please make sure all your information is entered correctly. You can change personal information by pointing your cursor over the gray bar with headings like "Family" and "Contact," and an "Edit" button will appear. When you click on your picture, or if there is no picture click on the empty head silhouette, you are given the option of selecting a picture from your computer or device. Simply click on the "Upload Image" button in the pop-up window, and choose the photo you wish to use. Please remember that sharing your picture is a way to say "welcome" to new members!

It helps church leaders complete required reports if you include your birthday. Only the Breeze Administrator or other family members can see your birthdate (if family also have an account), this is not visible to any other members. You can search for other members entered in Breeze by entering their first or last name in the search field on the right toward the top of the page. You can see a list of all church members and friends by selecting "People" towards the left at the top of the page. If you

forget your username or password, you can create a new password or notify the Church Office Manager, and a new invitation will be sent to you during Church Office hours.

If you find Breeze too difficult to read or navigate, it's okay! Printing a directory from Breeze is very easy and can be done regularly to ensure you have current contact information for members and friends. Please let the Church Office know this is your preference. The easiest way is to send an email with the subject title "Need Printed Directory." Directories will then be placed in your church pocket, in the hallway near the Church Office, on a regular basis.



Capital Campaign Team

"Sharing our stories, investing in the story, continuing the story."

Many of you may remember the cold sanctuary during the winter and early spring. Unfortunately, at another time Creekside Nursery School had to close a few days and at another point the offices were below recommended temperatures so Pastor Kirk and Cheryl worked from home. One of the major projects that the Capital Campaign Committee has identified has been replacement of boilers in the church building with a high efficiency system. These boilers were installed in 1983 and have served us well. The Committee appreciates all the work done to date obtaining estimates for replacement, as well as contributions received toward the boiler replacement.



During its July meeting, the Committee selected John W. Danforth Company, with a local office in Victor, as the best estimate received for replacement of the boilers. As expected, all aspects of the boiler replacement project have increased in price from the original estimate received in March 2024. The Committee has approved and signed the updated quote. Arrangements are currently being made for an installment date agreeable to both the church and Danforth.

The Committee invites you to share your thoughts by either contacting any member of the committee, sending an e-mail to the church address, or by dropping a note in a folder that the Committee has established outside the church office. If you feel you can offer expertise or information on a particular need, that would also be most welcomed.
